The first organizational meeting of the P.E.I. Roadrunners Club was held recently at St. Jean Elementary School.

The purpose of the meeting was to form an organization which would provide information on all aspects of running for both novice and experienced runners in addition to organizing meets.

The importance of working at the grass roots level was discussed and to this end a committee was appointed to prepare a packet for beginning runners. Contained in this packet will be information on running and jogging technique, proper clothing and footwear,

prevention of injuries, and other information which will help the beginner.

The club will affiliate with the Roadrunners Club of Canada and will work very closely with the P.E.I. Track and Field Association. County co-ordinators will be selected and will be responsible for the promotion of running and jogging in the communities of their county.

In addition to providing a packet for beginners, other future plans include: making available to the membership resource material related to all aspects of running and jogging; mini-workshops by resource

people; establishment of recreational running for families; competitive meets for the more experienced runner; and a newsletter.


MEETING
