

The Big Run For Little Brothers started simultaneously in St. John's, Nfld., and Victoria, B.C. Saturday, May 27 and runners will arrive at Borden 7 a.m. June 5.

P.E.I. participants will then take the batons containing a ceremonial scroll to be signed by dignitaries in each location. Runners will arrive in Summerside by 10 a.m. where they will stay for one hour. Then on to Miminegash, passing through villages along the way. The runners are scheduled to arrive in Miminegash at 1:15 a.m. June 6.

Parker Lund who is in charge of the Island runners says they will arrive in Charlottetown 6 p.n. June 6 and will visit the grounds of Government House where they will be met by Lt. Governor Gordon Bennett and Mayor Frank Moran.

During this period the signing of the scroll will take place.

The runners will continue, reaching Souris by 6:55 a.m. the next morning and will reach Wood Islands by 2:30 p.m. June 7.

CONFIRMATION

"By tomorrow I hope to have confirmation of all the runners participating," says Mr. Lund who is a big brother. "One run-ner will carry the baton but there may be nine or 10 runners running beside him for sup-

A large field of 43 runners competed in the 12Km (7.5 mile) roadrace. Forty-two of the starters finished.

The first female runner in was Suzanne Schmidt of Charlottetown, recent winner of the Octoberfest Fun for females only. Schmidt was 30th overall in 59:09.

Other medal winners were Kay Lund, Charlottetown, second in the female division placing 35th in 59:41 while Belinda Cummings was third (42nd) in 75:55.

Placing second overall to Lehmann was Mike Armitage, Charlottetown in 42:38. Only 21 seconds back in third place was Ed Fraser while Andrew Van Wicken was fourth in 43:08. Finishing fifth was Gary Andrus of Charlottetown in 43:23.


The top five finishers and the first female runner received trophies from Callbeck's Ltd., sponsors of the first P.E.I. Roadrunners Club race in Prince County.

Lehmann finished the 12 kilometer (7.5 miles) race in 40 minutes and 42 seconds. The event began and finished at the Bedeque Area Rec. Centre.

A total of 43 runners competed in the race, and 42 conquered the wind and rain to finish. There were 38 Island runners competing, and six others from points in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

Finishing second overall was Mike Armitage of Charlottetown (42:38), and third overall was Eddie Fraser of Charlottetown (42:59) Ewen Stewart Charlottetown, as usual, won the Master Division (over 40) in a time of 43:33. He was sixth overall.

Suzanne Schmidt of Charlotteetown was first in the Women's Division, while Kay Lund of Charlottetown was second, and Belinda Cummings of Charlottetown was third. Schmidt was 30th overall in a time of 59:09; Lund was 35th overall (59:41), and Cummings was 42nd overall (75:55).

The advent of winter may not be far off, but the road-runners are still pouring it on. The next event on the schedule takes place tomorrow at Bedeque, where the P.E.I. Roadrunners' Club will stage "The Dunk River Run" at 2 p.m. The race will cover 7.5 miles, and will have six classifications: four for men'; under 20 years, 20-29 years, 30-39; and over 40 years; and two for women: under 25 years, and over 25. They expect 50 entries for the event, which is being sponsored by Callbeck's Ltd.
